



2012 ANNUAL REPORT

Littlefeet Environmental (the **Charity**) hereby presents its 2012 annual report and year in review:-

- In March 2012, the Charity's co-founder Andy Farmer headed overseas to Huatulco in Oaxaca, Mexico to take part in the 32nd Annual International Sea Turtle Symposium (**ISTS**) – this is a global networking and research opportunity for individuals working and/or studying sea turtles. Andy was able to see old friends, facilitate new partnerships and celebrate with our colleagues at Akazul who won the ISTS 'Grassroots Award' for best sea turtle project.
- The Charity facilitated its first volunteer sea turtle expedition to Playa Larga beach on Isla Bastimentos, Panama. For 2 weeks, the Charity's volunteers worked together with members of local communities and research assistants from the Endangered Wildlife Trust to conserve critically endangered sea turtles, such as the Hawksbill (*Eretmochelys imbricata*) and Leatherback (*Dermochelys coriacea*), who utilise this beach for nesting purposes.
- From September to December, the Charity was able to collaborate on several public beach cleans in partnership with Sea Shepherd - Channel Islands. During the year, both organisations contributed to the removal of more than 1,500kg of marine pollution from local beaches in Jersey.
- The Charity earned some of its first donations to the tune of £150 via car boot sales and Christmas markets by way of selling handmade bracelets, key chains and pastries.
- The Charity also extends gratitude and thanks to committee members Ashley and Sadie Johnson for assisting the Charity, on a voluntary basis, with fundraising and the promotion of its charitable objects.
