



2013 ANNUAL REPORT

Littlefeet Environmental (the **Charity**) hereby presents its 2013 annual report and year in review:-

- The Charity celebrated its 5th anniversary as a not-for-profit organisation.
- Over the course of 2013, the Charity hosted 28 public beach cleans in partnership with Sea Shepherd – Channel Islands and took part in our largest beach clean initiative to date in terms of volunteer participation (18 volunteers) and the overall amount of marine pollution collected (300kg).
- The Charity saw success with the acceptance of its first research grant from IDEA Wild which was utilised to purchase a PIT (*passive integrated transponder*) scanner and tags for the purposes of our pilot sea turtle conservation project in the Banco Chinchorro Biosphere Reserve, a coral reef atoll situated 40km offshore within the Mexican Caribbean.
- We arranged a series of beach cleans with STEPS Jersey, a joint venture between MIND Jersey, Autism Jersey, Jersey MENCAP and the Jersey Employment Trust, who were working to provide motivating activities which encouraged community integration and environmental stewardship for those living with mental health issues.
- The Charity's co-founder, Andrew Farmer, and project coordinator, Courtney Farmer, successfully completed the marine mammal medic course as delivered by the British Divers Marine Life Rescue (*BDMLR*).
- Several members of the Charity were invited to take part in preliminary focus groups with an aim to assist in rewriting certain marine protection laws in Jersey. They also took part in adhoc 'Shore Thing' surveys which were developmental research opportunities that encouraged the distribution of and participation in marine education initiatives throughout the island.
